

**Admiral Run:** 1902-1910. A small School at the top of Admiral Hill Road at Gladstone about 30 Kilometres from Masterton The station was a part of a large sheep station owned by Messrs Pain and Sutherland.

27<sup>th</sup> October 1903 Mr Pain (of the Admiral Run) intends completing the road he commenced, so that he can open up the vast Totara bushes to sawmills. He is having a large house and woolshed, and numerous out buildings, built of heart Totara This district is beginning to feel the want of rain pretty 'badly now.

26<sup>th</sup> April 1904 Admiral Run School Messrs. Sarah Sutherland (Chairwoman and Secretary), and Messrs. G. Pain, J. Sutherland, A. McAllister. and D. Smith School Committee. *This is the earliest I have seen a women elected on a School Committee let alone being chairwoman*

13<sup>th</sup> September 1905 WANTED, by 1st October, Teacher for Admiral Aided School, 5 children, standards from 3rd to 7th; teach piano; salary £50, board and residence provided. Apply to J. O. Sutherland Admiral Run Gladstone

28<sup>th</sup> November 1906 Shearing at Admiral Run is finished. Eight thousand sheep were shorn. The highest tally recorded was made by a Maori named Tutu, with 150 in the nine hours' day, whilst several others had 145 to their credit.

29<sup>th</sup> May 1908 Aided School at Admiral Run.—On the application of Mr. Sutherland, it was decided to establish an aided school at Admiral Run

25<sup>th</sup> February 1909 At the meeting of the Wellington Education Board to-day, leave of absence was granted to the following teachers:— Miss C. McKenzie, Newtown, extended leave to end of month; Mr. G. S. Sharp, Admiral Run 15<sup>th</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> March

12<sup>th</sup> July 1909 HOUSEHOLD SCHOOLS- Admiral Run (Carterton) Sole Teacher-£90 to £120, and £10 H.A. (Musical qualifications desired

13<sup>th</sup> August 1909 R. B. Hill, Admiral Run (one week from Bth November);

1<sup>st</sup> March 1911 R Hill resigns
