May Ensor only taught at Mangaoronga

Gertrude M Corbin only taught at Mangaoronga

Robertina M Milne after Mangaoronga taught at Tablelands from 1908 to 1910, then Korokoro South in 1911, Pirinoa in 1912 and 1913 and Mikimiki Valley (Not Mikimiki) school in 1914

Muriel Grey Taught at Eketahuna in 1909 and 1910 as a Pupil Teacher

30<sup>th</sup> September 1904 That the following requests be declined:—Kilbirnie, painting of residence; Mangaoronga (aided), allowance for rent.

27<sup>th</sup> January 1905 Miss Margaret Player has been appointed to the charge of the aided school at Mangaoronga.

31<sup>st</sup> August 1906 Wellington Education Board to ask Department of Education for subsidy of £15 to £20 half cost of improvements Mangaoronga

13<sup>th</sup> December 1906 Mrs M Ashdown resigns

1<sup>st</sup> February 1907 Wellington Education Board Application for grants for Mangaoronga and Waterfalls (Tiraumea) declined

15<sup>th</sup> February 1908 Miss M. P. Grey, daughter of Constable Grey, of Eketahuna, has been appointed sole teacher at the Mangaoronga

10<sup>th</sup> June 1908 During the past few days a wandering bull has installed himself as keeper of the Mangaoronga Road, and people who have occasion to use the thoroughfare have done so at great personal risk. Yesterday morning, says the "Eketahuna Express," Miss Grey, teacher at Mangaoronga, was compelled to beat a hasty retreat on her bicycle, owing to a challenge thrown out by the animal. It is understood the bull is still at large.

26<sup>th</sup> February 1909 Wellington Education Board Miss M.. Grey, Mangaoronga to Eketahuna;

28<sup>th</sup> October 1909 That the committee at -Mangaoronga be required to refund the unexpended balance of committee funds
