I (researcher) was sent to Marima by the Wellington Education Board as a reliever in 1967. The house had been built by the locals and was opposite the old school which was in the local hall. A newer Avalon planned school had been built around the corner on a piece of land given by Trevor Lund. I had 11 boys and 1 girl in my class and at the end of the year the parents of her decided to send their children to Mangamaire, much closer for them and better for Glenys. The rest of the families decided to close the school. The building was later taken to Tinui School. I married the sewing teacher.

Isabella Osborne was Female Pupil Teacher at Mount Cook Infants and then Terrace school in Wellington before probably going to Training College for 2 years before doing one years teaching at Marima

James Macfadzean only taught at Marima for the Wellington Education Board. Name spelling

is correct No other record of him available In 1896 was in the Waikato, 1905 in Marlborough, 1911 Oroua Manawatu, 1919 Rangitikei or Waimarino

Mary Dynan started at Ohau Horowhenua in 1897 and in 1900 was at Manakau and then 2 years at Levin all as a pupil teacher, she then came to teach at Marima Though appointed to Kopuaranga it does not appear she was there at the end of 1906

James Patrick was in the Pahiatua Area in 1911 and Wellington in 1905-1906 on the electoral Rolls. He then went back to Matura in Southland

6th June 1901 Wellington Education Board It was decided to take no steps towards establishing schools at Upper Waingawa and Upper Taueru and Marima.

Mary Dynan started teaching in 1897 at Ohau Horowhenua as a pupil teacher .In 1900

3rd March 1902 A TEACHER is required for the Aided School at Marima, near Pahiatua-; salary ,£45. Applications to be sent to Mr. Wm. ' Beach, Marima, Pahiatua, from whom full particular can be obtained [An aided school is where the Education Board pays a grant per head and the School Committee are responsible for all costs]. Appointments like Isabella Osborne are made by the School Committee]

20th March 1903 Wellington Education Board to make appointment Sole Teacher. Marima; average attendance 10. Salary £60..

1st April 1903 Wellington Education Board annual report included and a. new school has been established at Marima in a rented building

8th August 1903 Marima; Sole Teacher average attendance 10. Salary £60..

28th August 1903 Miss Trent's resignation as sole teacher at Marima was accepted.

15th August 1904 Marima Sole Teacher £80

7th September 1904 Miss M Dynan appointed Sole Teacher at Marima near Pahiatua

20th December 1905 Kopuaranga Notes included the appointment of Miss Mary Dynan, sole teacher at Marima, to the position of assistant, was approved.

13th March 1906 sole teacher at Marima, Miss Gladys Haggett of Mangaone

31st August 1906 Wellington Education Board That subsidy on the cost of shelter sheds at the following schools be granted;—Huia : road, £5; Marima, provided shed is made so as to be conveniently removed £5

25th November 1908 Commissioner of Crown Lands: Crossing the Mangatainoka they proceeded along Marima. where there is a sawmill, a school and a fair population. The roads were found generally in good condition

11th May 1909 A meeting of the Marima Hall Committee " was held on Saturday evening. The report and balance sheet for the year was very satisfactory, and the

1st October 1909 Wellington Education Board hat various applications from Kilbirnie, Marima, Taueru (removing allowance), "Upper Hutt,. Pongaroa use of site .for 'brickworks); and Khandallah' be declined.

20th January 1910 Scholars who were not candidates for scholarships have qualified by examination for junior free places at secondary school included Gilbert Sealey, Marima

6th August 1910 Lansdowne School Committee It was resolved to recommend to the Board the appointment of Miss Haggett. who is at present sole teacher at Marima, to the position of assistant teacher at Lansdowne

9th August 1910 Marima (near Pahiatua) Sole Teacher £1120 to £150 and £15 housing allowance

13th September 1910 Miss V. Ham has been appointed sole teacher at the Marima (Forty Mile Bush) school,

27th April 1911 School Committee MARIMA. — At Marima, Messrs S. Baggerley, G. Russell, J. Chaffe, F. Williams, O. Lund were elected. Mr O. Lund has been elected chairman.

10th October 1911 A successful school concert was hold in the Marima Hall on Friday evening. Visitors ws.ro present from Makomako, Mangahao, Mangamaire, Waiwera and Nikau. The teacher Miss Ham, formerly of Wellington), assisted by Miss Beatrice Elliott and Mrs. Watts, were largely responsible for the arrangements, and the programme was certainly a good one. Among the leading features were a Chinese action song, a Japanese fan dance, ; the "Marima Tin Can Band," and "Two ' School-mates." A dance was held afterwards. Mr. Lund occupied the chair at the concert, and, at its conclusion, thanked the visitors from outside districts for their patronage. A Maypole dance was capitally carried out by the children, and a violin duet by Masters Martin was greatly appreciated. The hall was nicely decorated

24th April 1912 School Committee Marima.— O. Lund (chairman), W. Martin, D; Sealey, C. 'Watts and J Holloway.

10th June 1913 Marima (Pahiatua District) — Sole Teacher, £120 to £150 and £15 h.a. (School will probably fall to grade 1 from 1st January, 1914, but salary now quoted will be maintained for 2 years from that date, although house allowance will be reduced to £10

3rd July 1913 Mr Donald Pallant, of Kakariki, has been appointed sole teacher at the Marima School

8th July 1913 Sole teacher, Marima, Mr D. Pallant (relieving)

25th August 1914 Teachers for the front included D K Pallant sole teacher Marima [14 teachers from Wellington Education Board in this announcement]

23rd February 1915 Miss I Wallace resins

14th April 1915 Marima (Pahiatua District)— Sole Teacher, £110 to £140 and £20 h.a

10th June 1915 Marima (Pahiatua district), Solo Teacher, £110 to .£140 and «£20 h.a. (during war)

The new school which is still in use at Tinui in 2019 was built about 1955, leaving the hall to become used occasionally for socials, a cupboard from the old school used as a National Library depot and a very good table tennis club and the odd farmer's meetings

Residence purchased in 1952 The school residence was built opposite hall and was built by locals for the Wellington Education Board [The researcher's father in Law brought timber down from Kinleith, he claimed. Illegally]

Rent was 4 shillings weekly in 1920

27th April 1946 House purchased by Wellington Education Board for £2400
