24th September 1897 Wellington Education Board TEACHERS are required for the Aided JL Schools at Tane and Tutaekara Ridge Road. Salary about £70 per annum

9th October 1897 The Board of Education has selected Miss Tulley [Tuely] for the position of teacher of the aided school at Tane, near Eketahuna.

7th March 1898 Inspector T R Fleming to inspect Tane on Thursday 24th March

22nd March 1898 Wellington Education Board School District Bounded on the north by the Kaitawa, east by the Hinemoa, south by the Alf red-, -ton, and west by the Rongomai and Makakahi School Districts.

24th 1899 The Polling Booth was held at Mr Hanson's house Tane so presumably there was no schoolhouse and most likely school was also being held at Mr Hanson's

Catherine Bertha Tuely Was on the electoral rolls until 1946 when she was in Auckland

She taught at Tane from 1897 to 1899

Kohinui from 1900 to 1904 Sole Charge

Ballance from 1905 to 1909 Assistant Female

Taita from 1910 to 1912 Assistant Female

Tokomaru (Horowhenua) 1913 to at least 1917

Ngaio from 1919 to at least 1921

Mount Cook Girls from 1923 to ? (My records end at 1923)

In 1885 Catherine's Father was living in Woodville and by 1888 he was at Waipawa

In 1889 Miss K Tuely was recommended as a Pupil Teacher at Waipawa

8th December 1882 Waipawa School Miss Tuely appointed pupil teacher for another year

7th September 1894 The Waipawa Mail says;—Miss Catherine B. **Tuely** was the pleased recipient of a handsome testimonial in the shape of a writing desk and gold brooch, subscribed for by the pupils, parents, and teachers of the district school, in recognition of her work and attention to her duties during her connection with it of nearly six years. The testimonial was presented in the presence of the

pupils by the headmaster, Mr G. W. # Williamson, who expressed the great pleasure it gave him to present Miss Tuely with this pleasing evidence of the regard and esteem she was held in by all connected with the school. Miss Tuely was very successful with the recent annual examination of the school, 25 pupils passing out of 26, while the Inspector characterised the

class subjects as “ excellent.” At the annual examination of teachers, held in Wellington at Christmas, Miss Tuely obtained a partial pass in Class E, and holds a license to teach from the Minister of Public Instruction.

21st September 1894 Hawkes Bay Education Board From Manga-atua, recommending the appointment of Miss Tuely as assistant mistress at a salary of -£50.—Approved,

9th November 1900 Miss Catherine B. Tuely has been promoted from the Whiteman’s Valley School to the charge of the school at Kohinui.

26th March 1902 Kohinui School. —There was plenty of evidence to show that Miss Tuely had worked hard during the year, and as she gets the school more in hand an improved condition may be expected. Paper work and exercise books showed careful supervision.

10th December 1927 Miss Tuely Mt Cook school had retired

26th July 1900 new salaries announced by Wellington Education Board M Linton Tane £31 10s increase

20th February 1901 Mr T R Fleming to inspect Tane on the 1st April

Mary Linton only taught at Tane for the Wellington Education Board .

27th February 1902 Wellington Education Board Mary Linton resigned

14th March 1902 The following transfers have been made Miss Dorset, from Wairere to Tane ; Miss Bray, from Hastwell to Wairere.

Olive Dorset was a pupil teacher at Scarborough [Named changed to Mangamutu later] School 1896 to 1898. Then two years at Wairere and another two years at Tane with a final school in 1904-1905 at Carterton School

At the end of 1905 and 1906 Olive M Dorset was sole teacher at Rewa for the Wanganui Board Rewa is on the Vinegar Hill State Highway North of Fielding [There were at least 2 female teachers also teaching for the Wanganui Education Board with the surname Rockel, just saying]

19th January 1904 Tane Miss Petrie appointed relieving teacher

20th February 1904 Looking at the number of teachers applying for positions in the Wellington Education Board Tane salary £96 13 applicants. 2 Married ages 22 to 48 five males

1st July 1904 Miss Petrie allowed 2 months leave of absence

30th November 1904 Miss Petrie Tane resigned

6th March 1906 Wellington Education Board is going to effect repairs at Tane

1st September 1906 Tane, erection of a short fence between girls' and boys' offices. [Offices where you go to do your business]

26th October 1906 Wellington Education Board to do painting and repairs at Tane

30th September 1907 Tane, repairs and painting, T. Bailey, £24 15s

Isabella Halley must have been sent up to Tane to finish off the year In 1903 she was at Newtown as a Pupil teacher 97 years a pupil teacher) and From 1906 to 1915 was a Teacher at Mt Cook Girls'

Edith M Johnson did long service for Wellington Education Board started in 1889 at Bush Gully with 2 students. Past Tuturumuri from Martinborough. Then 3 years at Tane. In 1908 she was at Akatarawa School for 5 years. Then at Wallaceville for another 5 years before coming back to be sole teacher at Kaiparoro until 1923 when my records end

There is not one mention of Tane school in any newspaper on Papers Past

In 1908 Rosa B Wiesner passed the D Class examination partially with a special mention for Brush Drawing as a Nelson candidate and on the 4th December 1911 R B Wiesner was electoral deputy at the Tane polling booth

22nd February 1910 Rosa B Weisner passed 3 subjects for Class C, Rosa only taught in the Wellington Education Board at Tane There were 2 other teachers with the Wiesner surname teaching for the Wellington Education Board at about the same time in the Eketahuna area.

Rosa definitely went to Catholic Schools in Nelson

25th July 1912 Miss R B Wiesner appointed to Te Aroha School as an assistant

31st July 1912 Resigns from Tane School

4th March 1915 Appointed to Horo Hora rapids and Maungatautari No 2 Half time schools
Sole Charge Miss R B Wiesner

18th July 1918 Relieving Teacher (War absence) Miss R B Wiesner Albertland North and Hotea North

There are no mentions of any of the Wiesner teachers after 1918 in papers past and Rosa Bertha was last on the electoral roll in 1919. Maybe changed her surname or left NZ or joined the Nuns in the catholic church

1st May 1912 Wellington Education Board Tane application for a septic tank was referred to the clerk of works

29th May 1912 Wellington Education Board Application for works at Tane declined

11th June 1912 Tane (near Eketahuna) — Sole Teacher, £90 to £120 and £10 housing allowance

31st July 1912 Miss R Wiesner Resigns

13th August 1912 and 10th September 1912 and 10th October 1912 Readvertised position

2nd November 1912 Mr Pryor of Masterton is at present acting as Temporary teacher at the Tane School

29th November 1912 The official opening on the occasion of the commencement of boring by the Mangaone Oilfields, Ltd., at Tane, took place A large crowd were present, including visitors from Wairarapa and Hawke's Bay. The speakers explained that the company had got the best style of drill in the world, and the highly-qualified experts in charge expected to bore 2000 feet in two months.....

15th January 2013 Position readvertised

11th February 1913 Miss R Wickens appointed sole teacher at Tane

10th March 1914 Tane (Pahiatua District)— Sole Teacher. £100 to £120. and £10 h.a.

1st April 1914 Miss R Wickens resignation accepted

6th May 1914 A very enjoyable evening was spent in the **Tane** school-room on Friday evening last, -when a farewell social and dance was tendered to Miss Wickens. schoolmistress, on the occasion of her approaching marriage. During the evening Mr. G. Judd, on behalf of the School Committee, presented Miss Wickens with an afternoon tea service, while Miss Winnie Jowers presented her with a silver mounted cake-dish, on behalf of the scholars.

14th July 1915 and 12th August 1915 Wellington Education Board Tane (Eketahuna district)— Sole Teacher, £110 to £140 and £20 h.a

27th July 1915 Mr C Wynyard resigns

1st September 1915 At football on Saturday, the Eketahuna District High' School team defeated a combined Rongomai and Tane schools team by 11 points to 9.

14th September 1915 Mr R J Frain appointed

After Tane R J Frain was at Horoeaka in 1919 and Pukenui in 1921 and Longbush in 1923

Before 1915 He was teaching for the Wanganui Education Board at Awahou South [North of Ashurst in the Manawatu]

24th August 1938 Mr. and Mrs. R. J. Frain. who have been school teaching in the district for several years, have been transferred to Silverdale
