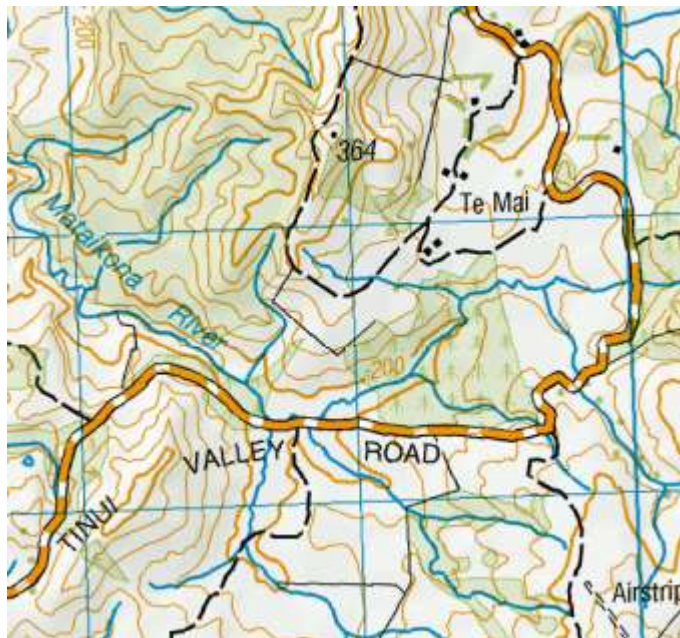

26 May 1897 NEW REGULATIONS. The Chairman of the Education Board this morning laid before the Board the following suggested amendments in the regulations for allocation of the Board's scholarships..... 4. Three scholarships of the annual value of £30, open to all children attending schools where the average attendance for the quarter preceding the date of the examination shall not exceed 100—96 schools, viz., Coonoor, Makairo, Ballance, Mangahao, Scarborough, Makomako, Kaitawa, Ngaturi, Te Aupapa, Makuri, Tiraumea, Nikau, Sherwood, Whakataki, Te Mai

20th March 1899 and the opening of the schools in the Fortymile Bush country at Nireaha, Hukanui, Mangamaire, Wairere, Makairo, Kakariki, Tane, Te Mai, and Pongaroa

24th April 1901 and the schools at Te Mai, Woodhurst, closed Wellington Education Board Report
