

Waiohine: 1905-1908 About 8 Kilometres from Greytown on the Waiohine Valley Road



19th August 1905 A Teacher is required for the Aided School at Waiohine Valley. Full particulars on application to Mr. T. C. Udy, Waiohine Valley, Matarawa, near Greytown G. L. STEWART, Secretary (Wellington Education Board)

29th June 1906 Waiohine grant for firing, etc. That the following be declined: —Waiohine expenditure on swing foot-bridge;

28th July 1906 Under consideration (For a building) .—Maranui (Kilbirnie;, Pahiatua, Lansdowne, Martinborough, Kaiwarra, Waiohine, Waterfalls,

30th May 1908 The present school at Matarawa is stated to be badly situated, besides having become old and dilapidated. The Waiohine School in the same neighbourhood, had to be closed, owing, it is alleged, to a bridge over the river intended for the use of the children being erected three miles away from their homes. The position of this part of the Wairarapa district was discussed on Thursday by the Education Board, and it was decided that the members representing the Wairarapa division should try and select a central and convenient site where a school to take the place of the existing Matarawa School can be erected

7th April 1908 Mrs. Leighton, formerly in charge of the Waiohine School has been transferred to Mangatiti.
